WHO IS FIT?

"Don't waste the high school on those who are not fit. It's a sinful waste of the city's money. Weed them out. Train only the fit ones."

Very good. But who is fit? And who is going to decide who is fit? The intelligence test? I doubt it. That helps some in grading and teaching economically but it is neither the first nor the last word on the training of a child.

Nobody knows who is fit for higher training. It isn't safe for anybody to take the responsibility for saying he knows and deciding the fate of a child on his guess. Guess is all that it is—supported to the last ditch by statistics and investigations though it may be.

There is a man in the United States today whose story will prevent those among us who know it from ever driving a child out of school or declaring him unfit or unteachable, no matter how dull or unresponsive he may be.

He was nearing the end of his teens and had not yet learned to read—was clogging the school and hampering the teachers. He was a nuisance and they finally put him out. He was wasting time and money. He was "Unfit" for higher education.

Was He?

He is at the head of a big educational institution and an authority on the education of young men. You would know his name were I to tell it to you. He has saved more youngsters from defeat than could be measured by one lifetime and has a wonderful time doing it.

The list of those declared unfit is long. It includes poets, statesmen, soldiers, inventors, teachers and scientists. Go slowly. NATURE IS VERY, VERY SLOW WHEN SHE IS BUILDING SOMETHING BIG. SHE SPEEDS UP ON THE ORDINARY ONES.

This is not a plea for the higher education of the feeble-minded. They, too, must be trained, but their training is broad, not high, and it lies on a different plane. It is a plea for the child who is slow according to school standards. He should be given all the time he needs and much sympathy and encouragement.

In the seedling bed was one that simply sat at the four-leaf stage. The others in the row were transplanted and transplanted until they reached the showy border and flowered, and there the one sat with his four sturdy leaves.

"He'll have to be moved so that he can be fed and watered. I'm sort of attached to him, sitting so patiently there with his four

leaves and all the others grown up and away," said the gardener one day. "I'll lilt him now and give him a chance in the other bed." Up he came on the trowel and such roots. A handful of beautiful fibrous roots.

"The rascal. Sitting there making roots all this time. He'll be a beauty. Never saw such roots growth. "Come along, old man, and we'll see some day." He was a prize winner, of course.

Look out for that slow one. Maybe he's making his roots. — (Editorial from the Chicago Daily News.)

"The day returns and brings us the petty round of irritating concerns and duties. Help us to perform them with laughter, and kind faces, let cheerfulness abound with industry. Give us courage to go blithely on our business all this day, bring us to our resting beds weary and content and undishonored and grant us in the end the gift of sleep."

Plenty of room for dives and dens (glitter and glare of sin,) Plenty of room for prison pens (gather the criminals in—) Plenty of room for jails and courts (willing enough to pay;) But never a place for the lads to race—no, never a place to play. Plenty of room for shops and stores (Mammon must have the best;) Plenty of room for the running sores that rot in the city's breast. Plenty of room for the lures that lead the heart of our youths astray. But never a cent on playgrounds spent—no, never a place to play. Plenty of room for the schools and halls, plenty of room for art; Plenty of room for teas and balls, platform, stage and mart. Proud is the city—she finds a place for many a fad today; But she's more than blind if she fails to find a place for the boys to play. Give them a chance for innocent sport, give them a chance for fun. Better a playground than a court and a jail after the harm is done; Give them a chance; if you stint them now, tomorrow you'll have to pay. A larger bill for a darker ill—so give them a chance to play.

Course of Study

The Illinois State Course of Study is well and favorably known in many states besides our own—and justly so, for it covers the common school curriculum as efficiency and thoroughly as any text possibly could

do. Last summer the Course was revised (sixth General Revision) and many changes made including the required physical training course (pages 60, 94, 150, 214,) the compulsory attendance law (page 24,) the requirements of the Sanitation Law (page 25,) besides numerous minor changes in the various grades.

Teachers should read carefully the first thirty pages, in fact, the entire book should be carefully read, not once, but many times during the year until they are familiar with the work. The general suggestions for reading: language, numbers, writing and physical training from page 32 to page 63 may well be applied to any grade and should be acted upon in conjunction with the directions preceding each month's work.

Rural teachers should follow the alternation plan closely; under ordinary circumstances no deviation should be made. Pages 14-15 of the Course of Study give a detailed explanation of the alternation plan. Classes in first, second, fourth, sixth and 8th year should be organized this term according to suggestions given on page 15 of the Course. You will plan your program according to the model on page 16 of the Course, arrange it upon the card for that purpose and place it in a prominent place in your school room. Such a card was furnished last year; if you find none in your school, write to the office and ask for one, as I expect to see one in use when I visit you. In making up bi-monthly grades count two-thirds on daily and one-third on examination grades.

You received with your supplies a daily grade book. I expect to examine it when I visit you.

Final Examinations

The Final Examination for the Eighth Grade Rural Pupils will be held at Carlinville on April 19, 1924 at the South Central School Building, beginning at 8:40 a. m.

The final examination for the schools which do not alternate will be held on April 26 at the same hour and place.

HIGH SCHOOL PRIVILEGES

Any eighth grade graduate residing in a non-high school district may attend any recognized two, three or four year high school and his tuition shall be paid by the board of education of the non-high school district in which he resides.

An eighth grade graduate in the meaning of this Act is any person of school age who gives satisfactory evidence of having completed the first eight grades of school work; by presenting a certificate of promotion issued by the county superintendent of schools or by passing an examination given by the school attended.

A recognized high school in the meaning of this Act is any public high school providing a course of two or more years of work approved by the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The tuition paid shall in no case exceed the per capita cost of maintaining the high school attended, (excluding therefrom interest paid on the bonded indebtedness) which shall be computed by dividing the total cost of conducting and maintaining the said high school by the average number of pupils enrolled including tuition pupils."

School Libraries

I am indeed sorry that so many rural districts report none or very few books in the library. Rural pupils more than urban pupils need larger perspective, and this may be gained through no better medium than books. Each district should have a set of supplementary readers, histories, geographies as well as a few instructive and interesting story books to supplement the regular branches.

In the past we have thought relatively too much about teaching people how to read and not enough about getting them to read after they learn how.

To develop the "reading habit" in each pupil should be one of the chief aims of every teacher. Train any child so he likes to read, so he is a real book lover, and he will educate himself if he never goes to school another day. Moreover, if a school has a good library it should aid greatly in educating the older people whose school days are over, but whose learning days should never be over. The saying of Thos. Carlyle "The true university of these days is a collection of books," cannot be too often repeated."

Standard Elementary Schools Circular Number 144 State Dept. Public Instruction

(Pages 42-45)

Probably the strongest influence that can be brought to bear upon the child to turn his thoughts and purposes to the living of right life is found in the reading of good books. Through reading he becomes interested in what has been done and what may be done to make life better. His aspirations are awakened, his ambition aroused, and he seeks to realize in his own life work and conduct the things in which he has become interested. Good books become his teachers and have the same influence upon the growth of his character that does the companionship of worthy people. To supply this need the Illinois Pupils' Reading Circle has been organized. A small library of books selected from its list, may be made of great benefit to the children.

School Boards Authorized to Purchase Libraries

Section 115 of the School Law of Illinois provides for the appropriation of school funds for the purchase of libraries after the provision has been made for the payment of all necessary school expense.

It is not lawful for any person to teach in the public schools of this state unless he or she has a valid certificate covering the

time of such teaching. This applies to substitute teachers as well. Do not ask some one to teach for you who has no certificate.

I think every rural teacher should be at school by eight o'clock A. M. especially in cold weather. It is their duty to have the school room heated to at least 68 degrees Fahrenheit by 8:30 A. M. For this reason, as well as various others, it is to the best interests of the teacher and the school for a rural teacher to board in the district.

Directors and teachers sometimes criticise the new heaters which have been installed, when it develops that the teacher does not understand the mechanism. If you have trouble with the stove ask some one whom you are certain understands such things to give you some suggestions. In most cases, a letter to the person or firm from whom the stove was purchased will be answered either with helpful suggestions, or some one will be sent to remedy matters. Do not let the children suffer when a few words might put an end to the trouble. When the teacher leaves the school room in the afternoon the fresh air intake, and the foul air outlet should be closed in order to keep the room warm over night.

Teachers and directors occasionally have misunderstandings over the length of the school months, holidays, etc., and for their benefit I wish to say that the school month is identical with the calendar month, i. e., if school commences on September 4th, the school month will end on the evening of October 3. If any days are lost from any cause, they should be made up at the end of the term rather than at the end of the month; in this way no complications will arise. The legal holidays in this state as given on page 74 section 188 of the school Law of Illinois are: "The school month shall be the same as the calendar month. But a teacher shall not be required to teach Saturdays or legal school holidays which are the first day of January, the fourth day of July, the twenty-fifth day of December and any day appointed by the President or Governor as a day of fast or thanksgiving, and no deduction shall be made from the time or compensation of a teacher on account of such days." Be very careful in making out your schedules, for a small error on your part may cause a deal of trouble.

In order to determine the average daily attendance divide the total number of days attendance by the number of days in each school month. Count each day a full day. It is well to put on the report any absence or tardiness, but each part of a day is counted a full day in making the daily average.

The writing in the school of this country is not being given the amount of atten-

tion it should. With the exception of a few city schools, there seems to be an attitude of indifference among the teachers as to the appearance of pupil's paper, when in truth, looks should be on par with correctness. The adoption of some system of writing is the best remedy for this evil, and the A. N. Palmer Methods of Business Writing is the one recommended for use in this county. This System has a Service Department and I ask that every rural teacher enroll in this service department and every principal and superintendent of city schools who has no system adopted to insist that the teachers under his supervision enroll in this branch. Do not consider your monthly report finished when you have completed making out the schedule; there is a report to make in the back of the register before your work is finished.

Several instances of teachers signing contracts with directors and then breaking them have been called to my attention. Needless to say, if the directors are willing to release a teacher there is no criticism to make, but I consider the breaking of a contract to teach whether oral or written, as unprofessional conduct and feel justified in refusing to register the certificate of such a teacher. If a teacher breaks her contract she may be sued in any court of competent jurisdiction. Please keep within the law.

Agents

Every so often agents make the rounds of the counties of the state to call upon teachers and school officers to sell some-

thing. Agents who are four-square should have the confidence and patronage of those who are in the market for needed things of standard type. Agents of questionable business tendencies should be dismissed on the spot. Time is too valuable to waste on them.

For the sake of safety, justice and economy do the following judiciously:

1. Investigate the character and business methods of the agent before you are caught.

2. Consider whether you really want and need what the agent has to sell.

3. Ascertain whether the price is right.

4. If the agent says, "The County Superintendent or Schools recommends it," please phone to the office and learn the truth. One hundred to one, the chances are that all such statements are false.

5. Please remember that I do not give agents testimonials. If what they have to sell cannot stand the test of "real merit," no one has the moral, or business right to prop things up with testimonials. No testimonial or recommendation can read goodness, or superior merit, into anything in which these qualities appear on the surface, only.

6. Please bear in mind that there is nothing so surpassingly good that you must have it immediately. Let no one force, or stampede you into purchasing anything. Let no glib, smooth and forceful talker make you feel that you are "nobody" if you will not make the purchase. Stand on both feet and assert your rights and your intelligence and manhood and womanhood. Take time to think and investigate. Action should never precede thought and investigation. It does not take long to phone, or write, for information. What are these privileges for if we do not use them before it is too late? Good people will respect this measure of caution and business acumen—about others you need not care.

7. Do not allow any agent to encroach on school time. This time belongs to the boys and girls. It should be kept inviolate for this purpose.

8. Do not allow agents to impose upon you in any way whatever. Stand for your rights and be as firm as they are insistent and eloquent. You are the most important of their proposed transaction. Why not carry out a definite program which will terminate matters to your liking?

If agents say that I said "so and so" please ask them to put it in writing for you, so you may send it to me. If they refuse, please take it down yourself and send it to me together with the name of

the agent. Falsifying and misrepresentation will not be tolerated.

10. Refuse to be the prey of unscrupulous men and women.

11. Beware of the beguiling words and arguments of total strangers who live where you cannot get at them after they have "done" you.

12. It is my sole purpose to help you, but you must also learn to help yourself for your own growth, protection and security.

Please put all of these suggestions into operation the next time. This office stands ready to do for all school interests what it can, in and out of season.

After an individual has recovered from a communicable disease, health authorities should disinfect the room, or house, thoroughly.

Disinfection is the treating of anything with chemicals for destroying disease germs. It is the process of purification from any infecting matter.

Fumigating is the using of certain fumes for the purpose of disinfecting.
The Closing of Schools and the Teachers' Pay

It has been ruled that when the schools are closed on account of the prevalence of communicable diseases the teachers are legally entitled to their pay if they hold themselves in readiness at all times to teach. However, if the school is closed in good faith on account of the exposure of teachers to communicable diseases to which the school is not exposed, the teacher must stand the loss of time, or else make up the same.

ENFORCING RULES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Court Decisions in Relation to Rules in Time of Smallpox Epidemics

The school law, in giving the duties of boards of directors, says they shall "adopt and enforce all necessary rules and regulations for the management and government of the schools."

The Supreme Court in interpreting the powers of school boards under Rule Six, gives the following opinions:

While school directors and boards of education are invested with power to establish, provide for, govern and regulate public schools, they have no authority to exclude children from the public schools on the ground that they refuse to be vaccinated, unless, indeed, in cases of emergency, in the exercise of the police power, it is necessary, or reasonably appears to be necessary, to prevent the contagion of smallpox, *Potts vs. Breen*, 167-67, *School Directors vs. Breen*, 60A-201, affirmed.

Children infected with or exposed to smallpox may be temporarily excluded or the school temporarily suspended; but such power is justified by emergency, and, like the necessity which gives rise to it, ceases when the necessity ceases. No one would contend that a child could be permanently excluded from a public school because it had been exposed to smallpox or that the school could be permanently closed because of the remote fear that the disease of small pox might appear in the neighborhood and that if the school should then be open and children in attendance upon it the public would be exposed to the contagion. *Ibid.*

A rule adopted by the State Board of Health compelling the vaccination of children as a pre-requisite to their attending the public school is unreasonable where small-pox does not exist in the community and there is no reasonable cause to apprehend its appearance. The power to compel

the vaccination of children as a pre-requisite to their attending public schools could be only derived from general police power of this state, and can only be justified as a necessary means for preserving health. *Lawbaugh vs. Board of Education* 177-572. *Lawbaugh vs. Board of Education*, 66A-159 reversed.

Other Supreme Court Decisions

A rule that would bar the doors of the school house against little children who had come a great distance in the cold of winter, for no other reason than that they were a few minutes tardy is unreasonable, and therefore unlawful. In its practical operation, it amounts to little less than wanton cruelty. *Thompson vs. Beaver*, 6-53.

A rule requiring all pupils to bring written excuses from their parents to teachers for absence and that such excuse must be satisfactory and reasonable, otherwise they will not be granted, is not a harsh one. It does not of itself indicate any sinister purpose or wicked force on the part of the directors. It does not trench on the rights of any one. This rule is not an attack upon, or an abridgement of the inalienable rights of a citizen *Churchill vs. Fewkes*, 13A-520.

The general principle is established by an almost uniform course of decisions that a public officer, when acting in good faith, is never to be held liable for an erroneous judgment in a matter submitted to his determination. All he undertakes to do, is to discharge his official duty to the best of his ability and with integrity; that he may never err in his judgments, or that he may never decide differently from what some other persons may think would be just, is no part of his official undertaking. *Churchill vs. Fewkes*, 13A-520.

When a teacher accepted an appointment subject to the requirements, rules and regulations of a board of directors, the teacher was bound by such rules and regulations, and a rule in force when such contract was made, that the directors might require teachers employed by them to teach in any department that, in the judgment of the board, the best interests of the schools might demand, was as much a part of the contract and as binding on the teacher as if such rule had been written at length in the contract before it was signed by her. *City of Jacksonville vs. Akers*, 11A-298.

The authority of a teacher over his pupil being regarded as a delegation of at least a portion of the parental authority, the presumption is in favor of the correct-

ness of the teachers' action in inflicting corporal punishment upon the pupil. The teacher must not have been actuated by malice nor have inflicted the punishment wantonly. For an error in judgment, although the punishment is unnecessarily excessive if it is not of a nature to cause lasting injury, and the act is in good faith, the teacher is not liable. **Fox vs. The People**, 84A-270.

When a teacher is selected and employed, the contract is for personal services of that teacher. A teacher cannot fulfill the contract by hiring a substitute. Absence without leave and the temporary substitution of another teacher, although competent is ground for dismissal. **School directors vs. Hudson**, 88-563.

This clause gives the school directors the power to dismiss a teacher for various specified causes, including negligence. Tardiness of 15 or 30 minutes on the part of the teacher two or three times a week constitutes negligence within the meaning of the statute, and the board of directors have a legal right to dismiss the teacher for that reason. **School Directors vs. Birch**, 93A-499.

Where a teacher is dismissed on account of the destruction of the school house the school board is not discharged from liability on its contract in the absence of an express agreement relating to such possible occurrence. The statute makes it the duty of the directors to maintain a school for at least seven months in the year, and the destruction of the school house does not exonerate them from the performance of this duty, as they can, in that event, rent a suitable room for school purposes. **School Directors vs. Crews**, 23A-367; **Corn vs. Board of Education**, 39A-446.

Whispering

Teachers should eliminate whispering. From the creation of schools, no one has ever advanced a single substantial reason for whispering during school hours. What does whispering disclose anyhow?

Illinois State Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund Law

GENERAL INFORMATION

Questions and Answers Regarding the Law
Who should make deductions from the salary of the teachers?

The clerks or secretaries of the school boards that employ teachers who are compulsory or elective contributors.

Who are compulsory contributors?

- (a) Those teachers who were hired as teachers for the first time after June 30th, 1915.
- (b) Those teachers from other states who have never taught in the public schools in Illinois—regardless of their length of service in the public schools in other states. Such teachers are classified according to teaching services previously rendered.

Who are elective contributors?

Those teachers who taught in the public schools, or were engaged to teach in them before July 1st, 1915, and made application to become contributors.

How much of the salary of teachers shall be deducted?

- (a) One dollar per month for the first five months taught after July first of each year shall be deducted from those who belong to the first class.
- (b) Two dollars per month for the first five months taught after July first of each year shall be deducted from those who belong to the second class.
- (c) Six dollars per month for the first five months taught after July first of each year shall be deducted from teachers who belong to the 3rd class.

Upon what basis are teachers divided into classes?

Upon length of teaching service in the public schools.

Into what classes does the law divide the contributors?

- (a) First class—Includes those who have taught ten full school years or fewer years and not more than fifteen full school years.
- (b) Second class—Includes those who have taught more than ten full school years and not more than 15 full years.
- (c) Third Class—Includes those who have taught more than fifteen full school years.

What shall be done with the money thus withheld?

- (a) It, together with the district's annual report shall be forwarded to the State Treasurer within seven days after the thirtieth of June.
- (b) Each contributor to the fund has an individual ledger account in the pension office and is given credit for the amount of his contribution.
