be sent to each teacher, so examinations may be held on October 24, December 23 and February 27. See that the work of eight months is covered before closing the year's work. If possible hold the examinations on these dates.

The final examination for rural pupils will be held April 18, 1925, in Carlinville. (All questions will be based on 7th grade work.) Examination will begin at 8:30 A. M. The examination will be based on the eight months work of the seventh year as outlined in the Course of Study with the exception of reading and civics.

The reading is outlined in the Plans for the Year. The questions in civics will be based on "My Country" as given in the first twelve chapters.

As the work in civics is done in four months, I suggest that three chapters be completed each month. Remember the physiology and the civics require four months each.

HIGH SCHOOL PRIVILEGES

Any eighth grade graduate residing in a non-high school district may attend any recognized two, three or four year high school and his tuition shall be paid by the board of education of the non-high school district in which he resides.

School Libraries

I am indeed sorry that so many rural districts report none or very few books in the library. Rural pupils more than urban pupils need larger perspective, and this may be gained through no better medium than books. Each district should have a set of supplementary readers, histories, geographies as well as a few instructive and interesting story books to supplement the regular branches.

A Library for Every School

In the past we have thought relatively too much about teaching people how to read and not enough about getting them to read after they learn how.

To develop the "reading habit" in each pupil should be one of the chief aims of every teacher. Train any child so he likes to read, so he is a real book lover, and he will educate himself if he never goes to school another day. Moreover, if a school has a good library it should aid greatly in educating the older people whose school days are over, but whose learning days should never be over. The saying of Thos. Carlyle "The true university of these days is a collection of books," cannot be too often repeated."

Probably the strongest influence that can be brought to bear upon the child to

turn his thoughts and purposes to the living of right life is found in the reading of good books. Through reading he becomes interested in what has been done and what may be done to make life better. His aspirations are awakened, his ambition aroused, and he seeks to realize in his own life work and conduct the things in which he has become interested. Good books become his teachers and have the same influence upon the growth of his character that does the companionship of worthy people. To supply this need the Illinois Pupils' Reading Circle has been organized. A small library of books selected from its list may be made of great benefit to the children.

Each teacher who adds the Illinois Pupils' Reading Circle Books to her school library will be entitled to twenty-five credits toward the registration or renewal of her certificate.

The writing in the school of this county is not being given the amount of attention it should have. With the exception of a few city schools, there seems to be an attitude of indifference among the teachers as to the appearance of pupil's paper, when in truth, looks should be on par with correctness. The adoption of some system of writing is the best remedy for this evil, and the A. N. Palmer Methods of Business Writing is the one recommended for use in this county. Contracts

Several instances of teachers signing contracts with directors and then breaking them have been called to my attention. Needless to say, if the directors are willing to release a teacher there is no criticism to make, but I consider the breaking of a contract to teach whether oral or written, as unprofessional conduct and feel justified in refusing to register the certificate of such a teacher. If a teacher breaks her contract she may be sued in any court of competent jurisdiction. Please keep within the law.

"In teaching the primary number facts and processes, there are three distinct phases of work that are of equal importance; but not, of course, requiring an

equal amount of time. These are (1) the first presentation of the fact; (2) drill upon it until the pupil has an automatic control of it; and (3) its use in simple everyday applications to give the pupil a full appreciation of its meaning and use"

FIRST YEAR

FIRST-FOURTH MONTH:

During the first semester the pupil learns to count, to know the name of the figures, a notion of positions, and gets a general feeling for the need of number in his play, and in his experiences in and out of school. The work of the semester should consist of the following:

- I. A number sense as: more—less; longer—shorter; many—few; high—low; etc.
- II. Sense of position as: right—left; above—below; up—down; over—under; top—bottom; etc.
- III. Counting.

1. By ones to 10.
2. By ones from 10 to 20.
3. By tens from 10 to 100.
4. By ones from 1 to 100.
5. By fives from 5 to 25.

Count familiar objects such as the boys present, the girls present, the pencils needed for the class, the windows, stars on the flag, the letters in the alphabet, etc.

The pupil is now able to use the Child's Book of Number. The work of the second semester should consist of the first 44 pages divided into four units as follows:
FIFTH MONTH:

Complete the first 10 pages. Use the reading matter for silent reading. Let the pupil fill the blanks as he reads silently. Then let him read aloud filling the blanks as he reads. After a fact is developed have him see how figures say them as on pages 3, 4 and 7. Then have him cover the sums and say or write them. Drill until every pupil can give all the facts automatically.

Get the pupil to delight in his work. Let him commit to memory the little rhymes and make up some of his own
SIXTH MONTH:

Complete the work on pages 11 and 22, inclusive. While all facts learned

are reviewed on page 11, go back occasionally and review the work of the preceding month.

The missing number drills on pages 11, 15, and 18, are to prepare for subtraction. There are no new facts to learn this month but the old facts are given in new forms. The subtraction facts are merely another form of asking the addition factor.

The pupil should learn this month to use the facts that he knows in adding three numbers. By adding from the top down, the exercises on pages 20 to 21 contain the facts the pupil knows. But to add from the bottom he would meet facts not yet known.

Make use of the games to motivate the drill. Let the pupils read descriptions and tell how to play them.

SEVENTH MONTH:

Complete pages 23 to 33, inclusive. There are five new facts and the "zero facts." But, all old facts are used in new forms, and with missing number drills.

Be sure that every fact on page 32 can be given quickly and automatically before the end of the month.

Use the text as a reader as well as a number book.

EIGHTH MONTH:

Complete pages 34 to 44, inclusive. Be sure that every drill page can be given automatically. Make much use of pages 37 and 42. Also use pages 40, 41 and 43. This begins the work of solving simple problems. Have pupils make up problems and games using number.

Second Year.

Stone's A Child's Book of Number.

FIRST MONTH:

Before taking up new work use the 44 pages of The Child's Book of Number, studied in 1 A. This should take two or three weeks. Be sure that all pupils can do this well. Continue to the bottom of page 48 this month.

SECOND MONTH:

Complete pages 49 to 59, inclusive. This completes the 45 primary facts of addition and pages 58 and 59 review all the facts learned.

Follow the developments and drills of the text. Notice the memory help on page 52 when adding to 9.

Keep up interest in drills by the games suggested.

THIRD MONTH:

Complete pages 60 to 72 inclusive. Also frequently review pages 58 and 59. Let children read the games for silent reading, then let them tell how to play them. Use pages 64 and 65 until pupils can tell all of any group of two numbers that make any number to 18. Use page 67 often until pupils can add three numbers within the tables.

FOURTH MONTH:

Complete pages 73 to 86 inclusive. Follow the methods of the text in developing all new work. Use all drill pages frequently.

FIFTH MONTH:

Complete pages 87 to 97 inclusive. The new work is written subtraction without carrying. Use the addition method as on page 87. Have pupils read this page and learn for themselves how to subtract. Stress such pages as 90 and 92. Let pupils make charts like the one on page 93.

SIXTH MONTH:

Complete pages 98 to 104 inclusive. Much time should be spent in adding three and four numbers. Give some such work daily. The scoring games suggested are easily made and are a very good way to motivate work.

SEVENTH MONTH:

Complete pages 105 to 120 inclusive. There is very little new work. The "two times table" is only another form of writing the doubles of addition. The table of fives comes by counting, as the pupil has already learned to count by fives. Spend much time adding four numbers.

EIGHTH MONTH:

Complete the remainder of the text. See that all addition facts are known, also the corresponding subtraction facts. Review all facts learned during the year, while getting the new work in multiplication and division.

Illinois State Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund Law

GENERAL INFORMATION

Questions and Answers Regarding the Law
Who should make deductions from the salary of the teachers?

The clerks or secretaries of the school boards that employ teachers who are compulsory or elective contributors.

Who are compulsory contributors?

- (a) Those teachers who were hired as teachers for the first time after June 30th, 1915.
- (b) Those teachers from other states who have never taught in the public schools in Illinois—regardless of their length of service in the public schools in other states. Such teachers are classified according to teaching services previously rendered.

Who are elective contributors?

Those teachers who taught in the public schools, or were engaged to teach in them before July 1st, 1915, and made application to become contributors.

How much of the salary of teachers shall be deducted?

- (a) One dollar per month for the first five months taught after July first of each year shall be deducted from those who belong to the first class.
- (b) Two dollars per month for the first five months taught after July first of each year shall be deducted from those who belong to the second class.
- (c) Six dollars per month for the first five months taught after July first of each year shall be deducted from teachers who belong to the 3rd class.

Upon what basis are teachers divided into classes?

Upon length of teaching service in the public schools.

Into what classes does the law divide the contributors?

- (a) First class—Includes those who have taught ten full school years or fewer than ten years.
- (b) Second class—Includes those who have taught more than ten full school years and not more than fifteen full years.
- (c) Third Class—Includes those who have taught more than fifteen full school years.

What shall be done with the money thus withheld?

- (a) It, together with the district's annual report shall be forwarded to the State Treasurer within seven days after the thirtieth of June.
- (b) Each contributor to the fund has an individual ledger account in the pension office and is given credit for the amount of his contribution.

TEACHERS' PENSION FUND ACT AMENDED

Teachers who failed to take advantage of the provisions of the Teachers' Pension Fund Act, prior to September 1, 1920, may be pleased to learn that an amendment to that Act permits them to do so now. It reads as follows:

House Bill No. 184 Approved June 27, 1923, Sec. 15. Any person employed as a teacher in the public schools of this State, coming under the provisions of this Act, when this Act takes effect or who has previously taught in the public schools of this State and resumes teaching, may at any time elect to come within the provisions of this Act by notifying in writing the Board of Trustees of the Illinois State Teachers' Pension and Retirement Fund.
