National Board Certification

ROE 40 is proud to announce we will be a cohort host for teachers and counselors pursuing National Board Certification during the 2020-2021 school year. This cohort will meet 12 times throughout the school year and is led by a trained National Board Certified Teacher who will guide teachers through the process at no cost. Teachers can earn 24 Professional Development clock hours as they complete their National Board components. The state offers a subsidy to pay for all fees associated with becoming a National Board Certified Teacher (there is a one-time \$75 registration fee – this is the only cost an eligible teacher will incur). Apply for the subsidy from September 1st, 2020 until October 11, 2020. Cohort support sessions begin statewide the week of September 13th, 1010.

Evidence-based strategies for individual counseling and mentoring, and classroom and school accommodations will be discussed. The instructors will guide educators in developing school-wide social/emotional learning strategies. All participants will be given time and direction in establishing their own action planning, based upon individual needs assessments in their schools.

DO YOU HAVE STUDENTS INTERESTED IN TECH CAREERS?

Looking for an interesting way to inspire students toward careers in cybersecurity or other science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines? Consider the National Youth Cyber Education Program, a national cybersecurity competition run by the Air Force to generate interest in technology careers.

The competition, which challenges and middle school and high school students to find and patch vulnerabilities in a virtual operating system, is held annually to help fill a global cybersecurity workforce gap. (One commonly cited prediction from 2018 holds that there will be 3.5 million unfilled cybersecurity jobs in the United States by 2021.) So far, 39 teams in Illinois have joined.






